OVERVIEW

In Shakespeare's "A Midsummer Night's Dream," the action unfolds amidst the backdrop of Athens and an enchanted forest.

The Duke of Athens, Theseus, prepares for his wedding to Hippolyta, Queen of the Amazons. Meanwhile, four young lovers —Hermia, Lysander, Demetrius, and Helena—find themselves entangled in a web of romantic confusion. Hermia's father, Egeus, insists she marry Demetrius or endure deadly consequences, but she loves Lysander. Helena, Hermia's childhood friend loves Demetrius but he is promised to Hermia. Lysander and Hermia escape to the forest but are followed by Helena and Demetrius.

Meanwhile, in the forest, Oberon and Titania, the fairy king and queen, are embroiled in their own dispute. Oberon seeks revenge on Titania because he is jealous that she will not give him the mortal child she has been rearing since the death of the child's mother. Due to their discord, the seasons and climate are out of sort and it is negatively effecting the mortal world. Oberon enlists the mischievous Puck to use a magical flower to manipulate Titania while she sleeps in her bower. In addition, Puck uses the magical flower to manipulate the lovers' affections.

Additionally, a group of amateur actors led by the bumbling Bottom enters the forest to rehearse a play. Puck's antics lead to mistaken identities, transformed appearances, and comical chaos. Ultimately, through a series of magical interventions and humorous misunderstandings, order in the fairy and mortal realms are restored and the lovers are reunited. Oberon and Titania bless the unions and everyone celebrates the harmony of love and reconciliation.

A Note from Artistic Director, Kelly Van Oosbree

Working with this fine group of actors on the poetry of Shakespeare has been an incredibly rewarding process. It has been a collaborative exploration of language, rhythm, and emotion, delving deep into language and human expression.
